shapes. This hike gets its name from the toadstool formations

as seen at the end of this hike. A toadstool is a rock formation which

has a boulder perched on a rock of a smaller diameter, like a mushroom,

or "toadstool." This environment is the perfect condition for these formations.

GETTING THERE

From Kanab drive 45 miles east on HWY 89.

- The parking lot and trailhead will be just past milepost 20 on your left.
- The trail begins just behind the information sign.
- Follow the wash and the well defined trail to the hoodoos.
- Exploring the surrounding area, you will see many balancing rock and hoodoos.
- This environment is an open and shadeless desert. It is extremely hot in the summer.
- Be prepared with enough water and sunscreen.
